Identified market need/want

- Public who may not be aware of social media across platforms.
- Public who may not be aware of the wide range of genealogy resources available both within the library and online.
- Public who may not be aware AI, Fake News, etc
- Council staff and councillors (and other stakeholders) who may not be aware of the resources available and the importance of Council records.

Objective 1

Objective 2

Raise awareness of the pitfalls of online activities.

Desired outcomes

- Hold a genealogy sessions with resources such as Ancestry, newspaper databases. etc and the public can try each to find out a little about their family.
- Hold 'being safe online' classes in the library.
- Check the message on your telephone system for when callers are put on hold. Promote new services and finish with the key message 'Libraries Transform Your World'
- Contact your community newspaper/radio station or association's journal or local council newsletter to celebrate and advertise all the programming and positive stories created in your library.
- And don't forget to create and display Libraries Transform posters and social media tiles for your library.
